Eligibility

- All former NASA or Army civil service, and contractor employees of the Langley Research Center (LaRC) who have either retired or left employment in good standing.

- The surviving spouse of an individual who qualified for membership.

Dues

- Dues are \$10 per year.
 For new members, the first calendar year is free.
- \$100 for Life Membership.
